May 2025

The Consumer Prices Index in Phnom Penh decreased by 0.6% in May 2025. Over the last twelve months' prices has increased 1.7% in May 2025. In April 2025 the rate of inflation increased by 3.1%. The Consumer Price Index for May 2025 has been calculated at 207.0.

May to April 2025

From May to April 2025 price for meat decreased by 0.5%. Main decrease this group was due to decrease price for pork decreased by 0.3%. Price for beef decreased by 0.5%. Price for chicken decreased by 1.3%. Price for duct decreased by 0.5%. Price for processed meat decreased by 0.3%. Price for fish and seafood decreased by 0.5%. Main decreased for this group was due to decrease price for fresh fish decreased by 0.4%. Price for processed fish decreased by 0.8%. Price for vegetables decreased by 1.4% and contribution by -0.1% units. Main decrease for this group was due to decrease price for leaf and stalk vegetables decreased by 1.6%. Price for fruits vegetables decreased by 1.4%. Price for root vegetables decreased by 1.2%. Price for tubers and mushrooms vegetables decreased by 1.3%. Price for pulses/legumes decreased by 1.1%. Price for fruits decreased by 1.2% and contribution by -0.1% units. Main decrease this group was due to decrease price for fresh fruits decreased by 1.3% and contribution by -0.1% units. Price for milk, cheese and eggs decreased by 0.9%. Main decrease this group was due to decrease price for fresh eggs decreased by 0.9%. Price for processed eggs decreased by 1.2%. Price for sugar, jam, honey, chocolate and confectionery decreased by 2.2%. Price for food products decreased by 1.1%. Price for alcoholic beverages decreased by 0.2%. Price for clothing and footwear decreased by 0.5%. Main decrease this group was due to decrease price for clothing decreased by 0.6% and price for footwear decreased by 0.5%. Price for housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels decreased by 0.4%. Main decrease for this group was due to decrease price for maintenance and repair of the dwelling decreased by 0.7%. Price for liquid fuels decreased by 1.2%. Price for solid fuels decreased by 0.9%. Price for furnishings, household equipment and routine household maintenance decreased by 0.2%. Price for health decreased by 0.5%. Main decrease for this group was due to decrease price for medicine products appliance and equipment decreased by 0.7%. Price for transport decreased by 0.3%. Main decrease this group was due to decrease price for gasoline decreased by 0.3% and price for diesel fuel decreased by 1.3%. Price for communication decreased by 0.1%. Price for recreation and culture increased by 0.2%. Price for restaurant decreased by 0.8%. Price for miscellaneous goods and services decreased by 0.3%.

May 2025 to May 2024

Of the total consumer price increased by 1.7% from May 2025 to May 2024. 1.4% units were due to increase by 2.4% for food and non-alcoholic beverages. Price for meat increased by 2.8% and contribution by 0.3% units. Main increase this group was due to increase price for pork increased by

2.7% and contribution by 0.2% units. Price for beef increased by 3.0% and price for chicken increased by 2.4% and contribution by 0.1% unit each. Price for duct increased by 2.5%. Price for processed meat increased by 1.9%. Price for fish and sea food increased by 2.7% and contribution by 0.5% units. Price for fresh fish increased by 3.4% and contribution by 0.3% units. Price for processed fish increased by 4.6% and contribution by 0.1% units. Price for rice remained stable in May. Price for vegetables increased by 0.2%. Main increase this group was due to increase price for leaf and stalk vegetables increased by 1.9%. Price for fruits vegetables increased by 8.2% and contribution by 0.2% units. Price for root vegetables increased by 6.4%. Price for tubers and mushrooms increased by 3.2%. Price for fruits increased by 3.4% and contribution by 0.2% units. Main increase this group was due to increase price for fresh fruits increased by 4.1% and contribution by 0.2% units. Price for milk, cheese and eggs increased by 1.7%. Price for sugar, jam, honey and chocolate increased by 3.2%. Price for food products increased by 4.5% and contribution by 0.1% units. Main increased for food group was due to increase of meat; vegetables; fruits and food products. Price for alcoholic beverages and tobacco increased by 2.1%. Price for clothing and footwear increased by 5.2% and contribution by 0.1% units. Main increase this group was due to increase price for clothing increased by 5.0% and contribution by 0.1% units and price for footwear increased by 8.0%. Price for housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels increased by 1.7% and contribution by 0.2% units. Main increase for this group was due to increase price for maintenance and repair of the dwelling increased by 5.6% and contribution by 0.2% units. Price for solid fuels increased by 0.9%. Price for furnishings, household equipment and routine household maintenance increased by 1.9%. Price for communication increased by 0.1%. Price for recreation and culture increased by 1.6%. Price for education increased by 2.3%. Price for restaurant increased by 1.4% and contribution by 0.1% units. Price for miscellaneous goods and services increased by 2.5%. While, Price for health decreased by 0.1%. Price for transport decreased by 3.8% and contribution by -0.3% units. Main decrease this group was due to decrease price for gasoline decreased by 11.0% and contribution by -0.3% units and price for diesel fuel decreased by 14.4%.

The increased for all index group 1.7% rate of inflation in May 2025 was due to the sub-groups such as: food and non-alcoholic beverages; alcoholic beverages and tobacco; clothing and footwear; price for housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuels; price for furnishings, household equipment and routine household maintenance; communication; recreation and culture; education; restaurant and miscellaneous goods and services.
